The Sunnynook Scout Group will be losing several leaders at the end of this year and is seeking suitable individuals to become replace them.

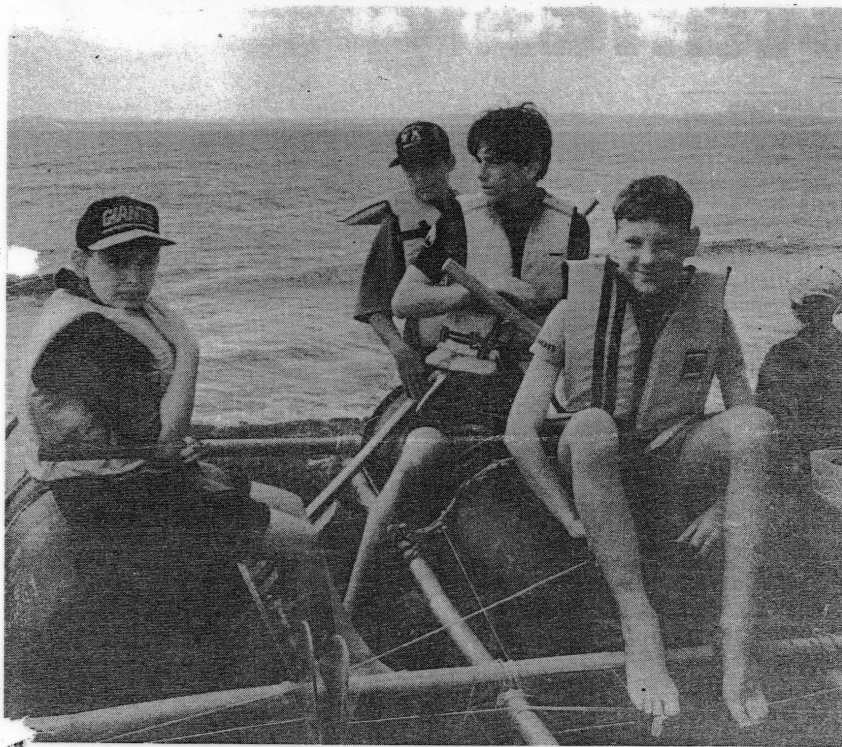
